THE PURPOSE OF THE STAKEHOLDER NETWORK

- Broadly disseminate information on the project and its progress to the wider community operating in the building industry in the EU
- Enhance awareness and visibility of the matters connected to the EU's Action Plan on the Circular Economy related to the built environment
- Enable coordination and collaborative work by allowing actors in the building industry value chain, academia and public authorities to work together within the framework of the BAMB project on 6 thematic areas
- Ensure the pertinence of the BAMB tools and products produced by providing actors within the building industry
 with an opportunity to directly provide feedback and influence the development of BAMB products
- Provide actors within the building industry with an opportunity to indirectly provide feedback on the EU's Action Plan on the Circular Economy
- Support the identification of further research opportunities



Through the BAMB Stakeholder Network, the BAMB Consortium aims to involve relevant stakeholders in the implementation and the results of the project.


The Stakeholder Network will be used to:

- Be invited to take part in the BAMB online platform.


WHO CAN BECOME A MEMBER?


